

Yan Pei-Ming Tuesday June 13

MASSIMODECARLO is delighted to dedicate an exclusive Focus section at its Art Basel Booth to the internationally acclaimed artist Yan Pei-Ming. Highlighting a series of paintings produced by the artist in 2023, the Focus brings to the forefront the artist's distinctive visual vocabulary of monochromatic portraits. Within this series, Yan Pei-Ming presents an iconic portrayal of Bruce Lee in the renowned martial art film Enter the Dragon from 1973. Alongside Bruce Lee's portrait, the Focus displays expansive depictions of fading dragons in red and white tones, aptly named Dragon céleste rouge and Dragon rouge céleste.

Yan Pei-Ming is widely celebrated for his monumental canvases, which come to life through vigorous and sweeping brushstrokes. The fusion of Eastern and Western cultural influences has shaped Yan Pei-Ming's expressive style and meticulous palette over his thirty-year career, resulting in international acclaim and recognition.

Yan Pei-Ming's celebrated exhibition Painting Histories at Palazzo Strozzi in Florence will open on July 6, 2023 and will present a selection of historical works alongside new paintings created specifically for this milestone exhibition. Yan Pei-Ming's work has been recently acquired by Gallerie degli Uffizi in Florence, marking the presence of the artist, born in China and based in France, among the most relevant painters of all times.

Spencer Lewis Tuesday June 13

MASSIMODECARLO is delighted to present a focus section on its Art Basel booth, to Los Angeles-based artist Spencer Lewis. This focus exhibition follows the success of Lewis's solo show at the gallery's Hong Kong outpost earlier this year.


Pouring himself onto the fuzzy texture of his jute canvases, Lewis draws lines and marks, spraying and splashing paint on a surface that absorbs everything and resists erasure. With purposefully chaotic, seemingly infinite layers, Lewis's canvases conceal and simultaneously unveil a brushstroke, a gesture over the other, stories and moments culminating and accumulating on the painting's densest parts.

Painting on unprimed jute exposes the artist's instinctual and unruly pictorial language, exhibiting a distressing authenticity and blatant selfhood. Aggressive, bright hues blend in with the earthy tones of the jute, creating crusty patches of colour that hide and store previous signs and brushstrokes.

Stockman's paintings are the fruit of her sensibility to a very diverse range of influences, capturing the enchantment found in the simplicity of shapes and everyday life. The artist employs structural methods to portray what she refers to as "the experience of being in the natural world." 





In 1964, Accardi inaugurates a groundbreaking chapter in her career, by choosing to replace canvas with sicofoil. This transparent, malleable plastic sheet opens her field of experimentation in a revolutionary way. Not only does the transparency of this cellulose acetate allow her to go beyond the frame, she also pushes her material experimentation further by creating woven patterns directly with the sicofoil, which she embroiders directly onto the frame – as can be seen in Quattro triangoli arancio 1970. With sicofoil, she thus emancipates herself from the classic square or rectangular shapes of the classic canvas, producing unique geometric assemblages.

A major Italian post-war artist, Carla Accardi was born in Trapani, Sicily, in 1924. After studying in Palermo, she moves to Rome in 1946, where her artistic career sets off. As the only woman and founding member of the "Forma" group, she quickly establishes herself as a leading figure on the international artistic and intellectual scene, both for the singularity of her practice and for the ardor of her political commitment.





Over the years, Elmgreen & Dragset have consistently been part of the gallery's programming. For this edition of Art Basel, the Scandinavian duo presents their iconic installations.

One of their featured works is "I" from 2023, which showcases a boy standing before a mirror, tracing an "I" with his finger on the reflective surface. As we contemplate our connection with this child, the motionless figure carved from white Carrara marble serves as a reminder of its artificiality. Similar to a mirage glimpsed through a windowpane, "I" possesses an ethereal quality, simultaneously engaging and disregarding us.

Elmgreen & Dragset's sculptural practice often explores themes of masculinity and upbringing, challenging conventional portrayals of heroic males. While many of their figurative sculptures employ classical materials like bronze or marble, they are situated within contemporary contexts and narratives. Continuing their exploration of these themes, "I" adds to their body of work that delves into the emotional complexities of childhood.

Jim Hodges transmits emotions and narratives creating poignant, delicate artworks based on temporality, life and love. The artist's iconic gold leaf paintings originate from an intuitive drawing process, that is then retraced onto the canvas. Using poetic gestures, seemingly simple materials are used to transmit emotions and draw attention to the passing of time and ultimately to mortality. Indeed 24 karat gold is a material that changes its luminosity with the time of day, and despite its fragility, it can endure outdoor weather.





This work is an archetype of pioneering italian artist Enrico Castellani's avant garde artistic practice. Merging sculpture, architecture and painting, Castellani's complex minimalism challenged the frontiers between disciplines. Superfice bianca perfectly exemplifies the artist's deep concern and elaborate with the use and manipulation of light. A taught white canvas studded with alternated, regularly placed nails both under and over the canvas create a geometric pattern altering the plain surface across to create new light geometries on the square canvas.




Enrico Castellani, Superficie Bianca, 1963 (detail)

Jennifer Guidi makes color her medium. Radiating from the canvas, layers of pure color appear to move in controlled, repetitive dabs of granual paint, animating the composition in a hypnotic, circular outpouring of mystic solar energy. Often working to music, Guidi shares that each painting is a form of meditation: repeating the same gesture over and over again has become a ritual in and of its own, adding layer upon layer of colour to achieve pure light scapes. Never quite centered the focal point of her mandala compositions are purposefully shifted slightly to the left, reminiscent of the left hand which comes from the heart, evoking the artist's intuitive, meditative process.

Concerned with the poetics of travel and the notion of reaching otherworldly universes, Jean Marie Appriou defies gravity : is this figure falling, floating, reaching out to embrace the veiwer? Crafted in patinated bronze, the body is mired with the intricate details of his airtight suit, leaving hands and feet exposed. Alongside his presence on the booth, Jean-Marie Appriou has been selected to take part in the fair's Unlimited section. Horizons (2023), a monumental boat sculpture – the artist's largest to date - was conceived specifically for Art Basel Unlimited 2023.




Jean-Marie Appriou, Mitosis (cellular being), 2023 (detail)







Carl Andre's Ninth Aluminium Cardinal (1978), is a quintessential example of the now signature 'Cardinal' forms that Andre made throughout the 1970s. 'Cardinals' refer to the mathematical principle of cardinal numbers and consist of a number of square metal plates: "The number of units in the rows is always a prime; the number of units in the squares is always a square; and the number of units in the rectangles is always the product of two cardinals." [Oktagon, pp 188-189]. Ninth Aluminium Cardinal was notably made by Andre in Japan, as part of his first solo exhibition in Japan at Art Agency Co., Tokyo in 1978. The use of 50cm large plates in the sculpture gives the work the presence and substance of Andre's best work, while its aluminium polished surface elegantly creates an interaction with the work's environment beyond the surface of the sculpture, reflecting the light that hits it back out into its surroundings.
