
born 1960 in Westchester County, New York, USA lives and works in New York, USA

In his large-scale watercolour painting *Geist* (Spirit), 2023, Walton Ford depicts a majestic black panther in a snowy mountainscape flooded by moonlight. In the foreground, a crackling fire emits a warm orange glow. The composition belongs to a body of paintings, initiated in 2001, which were inspired by the great escape of a female panther from Zürich Zoo in 1934. The animal survived for two months in the Swiss alps, before being killed for food by a local farm labourer. 'A series of paintings might begin with the discovery of an almost forgotten book,' the artist explains. 'A firsthand account, however brief, will fuel the fantastic. If all goes well, a panther magically escapes and melts into the landscape. She is out there somewhere; I stay in my studio and try to find her.'

Ford is known for his monumental and richly detailed watercolours depicting wild animals in the human imagination. His work elaborates on the tradition of natural history painting, pairing historical facts and surreal imaginings.







Albert Oehlen's work is currently the subject of a solo exhibition at Friedrichs Foundation, Weidingen, until 17 December 2023; and a group exhibition at Museum Penzberg | Sammlung Campendonk, until 25 February 2024.


Albert Oehlen's *Untitled*, 1989, belongs to the artist's seminal series of 'Spiegelbilder' (Mirror Paintings). Spanning an eight-year period, from 1982 to 1990, these paintings straddle a decisive moment for the artist, during which he moved from the crude figuration of the late 1970s and early 1980s, towards non-object painting in the late 1980s. Masterfully, combining both these elements, the Mirror Paintings merge recognisable forms – such as the winding staircase and compact interior space of the present work – with free-flowing, abstract brushwork.

Executed on a large format, *Untitled* presents a compelling play of colour, texture, light, scale and line. The composition flits between the realms of representation and abstraction, emphasised by gestural swills of paint and lacquer, drip marks, visceral smears and expressive brushwork. Distinguished by the inclusion of actual pieces of mirror collaged onto the surface of the canvas, works such as the present reveal the artist's desire to challenge the history of art and painting, using conventional tools – brush, canvas and oil paint – to make unconventional points about the medium.

Examples of Albert Oehlen's Mirror Paintings are in the collections of Kunstmuseum Bonn; Museum Abteiberg, Mönchengladbach; Museum Ludwig, Aachen; Pinakothek der Moderne, Munich; Staatliche Kunstsammlungen Dresden; Stiftung Kunstsammlung Nordrhein-Westfalen, and Zabludowicz Collection, London, among others.

Albert Oehlen's work is currently the subject of a solo exhibition at Friedrichs Foundation, Weidingen, until 17 December 2023; and a group exhibition at Museum Penzberg | Sammlung Campendonk, until 25 February 2024.

Albert Oehlen's large-scape diptych *Uurhyolth II-13*, 2001, is an exemplary work from the artist's body of 'Colour Computer Paintings' or 'Switch Paintings,' predominantly created between 1995 and 2006. One of the first to blend computer-generated imagery with traditional painting techniques, Oehlen had previously exclusively produced black and white versions of 'Computer Paintings' in the early 1990s. Resulting in what the artist has described as 'electric mud,' the present work offers a colourful play with abstract shapes and lines, surface and depth, and an exploration into the relationship between human and machine.

In the present composition, cool pastel tones of baby blue, pink and peach are broken up by a pattern of red and black diagonal stripes reminiscent of caution tape. Figurative elements such as sun-like circles emit a warm glow, amidst clinical blue screens, dark spray stains and watermarks. By exploring the harmonies and tensions between these contrasting energies, Oehlen captures the experience of living in the digital information age in a rich explosion of colour and form.

Comparable works from the series are in the collections of the Albertina, Vienna; The Broad, Los Angeles; Centre Pompidou, Paris; and Museum Ludwig, Cologne, among others.


