ERIK BULATOV – FORWARD

In everyday language, the phrase ‘forward’ is both a spatial and a temporal injunction, implicitly linked to an imperative and collective proposition, but one that induces a celebration of progress and the promise of a better future.

In these two monumental paintings, this order written in Russian, in black lettering, alternately advances towards the viewer or draws him towards the back of the canvas, playing out a double visual and graphic score. While these two works both oppose and complement each other, they do so against a background that is identical in each case, that of a stylized, radiant sun, partly obscured by the letters, which occupies the entire horizon line: clearly, the future looks bright!

The two canvases, painted in red, white and black, feature a perfectly clear, powerful design and lettering, accentuated by a sharp, dynamic relationship between the three colours laid down on large flat areas. There is no nuance, no modulation between them: they clash in an extremely strong way.

On a purely graphic level, the letters start from the left in perspective, heading in a determined way towards the center of the painting. When the word reaches the vanishing point or the center of the foreground, it immediately bounces back symmetrically, this time in the opposite direction, to the right.

Through the symmetrical repetition of two orders in two visually complementary directions, these orders cancel each other out.

Fascinated by the size of the painting and the graphic power of the whole, the viewer is attracted, drawn in by the interplay of perspectives, but ultimately blocked and repelled. The background of the painting is totally inaccessible. Paradoxically, the letters that seem to encourage us to move actually form an impenetrable barrier, they deny us access to the space where the sun shines. In reality, the double injunction offers no opening, no way out; it leads us nowhere, leaving us alone and destitute, in an artificial setting.

‘Forward’: this injunction fails here to open up a future, or even to manipulate a consciousness that would have followed this overwhelming order. The promise of the words is a delusion, a disappointment, and we, as spectators, are treading water.

Where were we supposed to go? Where was I supposed to go? Who is asking? What does this ‘forward’ mean? Where does it come from? Who is speaking? Exactly the opposite of an order, an imperative formula, these paintings provoke the viewer to reflect individually and existentially: fundamentally, they invite us to react, to think freely.

ERIK BULATOV

Born in 1933 in Sverdlovsk in the USSR (now Ekaterinburg in Russia), Erik Bulatov is one of Russia's most important living artists. His life and career reflect the many upheavals in European and world history.

Erik Bulatov studied at the Moscow Arts Middle School (1947-52) and then at the Surikow Art Institute in Moscow (1952-58). He very quickly became one of the most gifted and recognised students of his generation, but his refusal to accept the conventions imposed by the Communist system meant that he was ostracised: considered a non-conformist, he was completely banned from exhibiting. To survive, he and an artist friend, Oleg Vassiliev, became illustrators of children's books. This activity gave him remarkable recognition in this field and enabled him to continue his work as a painter, but without being able to exhibit his work.

In 1988, at the age of 55, he was able to show his work publicly for the first time in a solo exhibition at Zurich's Kunsthalle. A few months later, in the same year, he took part in 'Ich lebe - ich sehe' at the Kunstmuseum in Bern, along with other 'non-conformist' Russian artists (Ilja Kabakov, Oleg Vassiliev, Vladimir Yankilevsky and Grisha Bruskin, among others). These two exhibitions were to have a major impact on his career. Also in 1988, he was named UNESCO Artist of the Year.

From then on, his work gained international recognition, and he had one solo exhibition after another, first in Europe: Portikus in Frankfurt, Centre Pompidou in Paris, Kunstverein in Bonn, de Appel in Amsterdam, ICA in London (1988), then in the United States: List Visual Art Center in Boston, Newport Harbor Art Museum in Newport Beach, The University of Chicago (1989). He left the USSR in 1989, and after a short stay in New York, settled in Paris in 1991, where he now lives and works.
