Born in 1977 in Senegal, Omar Ba lives and works in Dakar and New York. His paintings, produced using a variety of techniques and materials, represent political and social motifs open to multiple interpretations. Recent solo shows include The Power Plant Toronto, Museum of Fine Arts Montreal, Royal Museum of Fine Arts of Belgium, Kunsthalle Mulhouse. His work is in many public collections including Centre Pompidou, Paris; Louvre Abu Dhabi, UAE; Baltimore Museum of Art, USA; Fondation Louis Vuitton, Paris; Fondation H, Madagascar. In 2023, his work was the subject of a solo show at La Kunsthalle in Mulhouse, Shared Destinies.



MICHAEL RAY CHARLES

Born in 1967, Michael Ray Charles is a pioneering artist in his exploration of the African-American question. Since the 1990s he has developed a complex body of work centering on representation and identity through the prism of American history and popular culture. After his first controversial success in the nineties, he chose to withdraw from the art world and concentrated on studio work and his own research. His exhibition in New York last spring marked his come-back after two decades. His paintings are now populated by various political figures who played a part in the history of the abolition of slavery and segregation, from Abraham Lincoln to Lyndon B. Johnson. He also takes a closer look at the major forms of discrimination that mark contemporary society, including the LGBTQ question and gender differences.

His work features in a wide range of public collections, including the Museum of Modern Art in New York, Museum of Fine Arts in Houston, Arizona State University Art Museum and San Antonio Museum of Art in Texas

On the occasion of the group exhibition *Spike Lee: Creative Sources*, Michael Ray Charles is exhibiting his works at the Brooklyn Museum in New York until February 2024. An immersive installation of objects drawn from Spike Lee's personal collection of artworks by prominent Black American artists.

PHILIPPE COGNÉE

Born in 1957, Philippe Cognée works in Nantes and Paris. A Villa Medici's laureate in 1990 and nominated for the Prix Marcel Duchamp in 2004, Philippe Cognée spent many years teaching at the Paris Ecole Nationale Supérieure des Beaux Arts, where he trained a new generation of figurative painters.

His work has been the subject of numerous solo exhibitions, including at Geneva's MAMCO (2006), the Haute-Normandie FRAC (2007), Musée de Grenoble (2013), Château de Chambord (2014), Fondation Fernet-Branca in Saint Louis (2016) and Domaine de Chaumont-sur-Loire (2020). It also features in a great many museum collections, such as at the Musée National d'Art Moderne – Centre Pompidou, MAM Paris, Fondation Cartier and Collection Louis Vuitton in Paris as well as the Museum Ludwig in Cologne, Musée Cantonal des Beaux-Arts in Lausanne and MAMCO in Geneva, which has recently commissioned two large-scale landscapes.

In 2023, he was invited for a major solo exhibition at the newly renovated Musée Bourdelle and by a show at the Musée de L'Orangerie, both in Paris, followed by a show at The Musée des Beaux-Arts in Le Mans.



WILL COTTON

Born in 1965, Will Cotton studied at the New York Academy of Art and fine arts school in Rouen. As well as Galerie Templon in Paris, he is represented by the Mary Boone Gallery in New York and Jablonka Galerie in Cologne. His work has been exhibited worldwide, including at the San Francisco Museum of Art (2000), Seattle Art Museum (2002), Kunsthalle de Bielefeld in Germany (2004), CAPC in Bordeaux (2005), Chelsea Art Museum in New York (2006), Triennale Bovisa in Milan (2007), Musée Marmottan in Giverny (2008), Cornell University Museum (2014) and Orlando Museum of Art in Florida (2017). He is also known for his artistic experiments in a wide variety of fields, from patisserie (with Ladurée) to music (a project with singer Katie Perry, 2010) and fashion (the What to Wear in Candyland project, Hudson Yard, New York, 2019). His work *Roping* is currently on view at the Louvre-Lens in a group exhibition with *Fantastic Beasts* until January 2024.




Exhibition view - Fantastic Beasts, The Louvre-Lens, Lens, France, 2023

GREGORY CREWDSON

Born in 1962 in Brooklyn, Gregory Crewdson lives and works in New York and Massachusetts. He studied at SUNY Purchase, New York, then at Yale School of Art, where he is professor and director of graduate studies in photography. His work has been widely exhibited and collected by numerous museums, including, in New York, the Museum of Modern Art, Metropolitan Museum of Art, Brooklyn Museum and Whitney Museum of American Art, as well as the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art and Smithsonian American Art Museum in Washington. In Europe, he recently exhibited his work at the Centre for Contemporary Art in Toru , Poland (2018), The Photographer's Gallery, London (2018), FRAC Auvergne in Clermont Ferrand (2017) and Gallerie d'Italia in Turin (2022). Galerie Templon showed part one of his trilogy, Cathedral of the Pines, in 2017 and part two, An Eclipse of Moths, in 2020. He has been represented by Galerie Templon since 2004 and this will be his fifth exhibition with the gallery.

His latest work *Eveningside*, a series of black-and-white pieces created between 2021 and 2022, is currently on display at the Grenier-Saint-Lazare space. This final instalment is a trilogy he has been working on since 2012 features twenty panoramic photographs characterised by their disturbing clarity and twilight mood.

ALIQUINE DIAGNE

Born in 1985 in Fatick, Senegal, Alioune Diagne lives and works between Dakar and Vienne in Isère, France. Graduated in 2008 from the Beaux-Arts in Dakar, he immediately distinguished himself by founding in 2013 an unique mode of expression: the «figuro-abstro-. Composed of a figurative created from an infinite number of tiny unique element, Diagne's work challenges by its complexity and the dynamism of its scenes which depict the daily life of the black community and the African diaspora through the worl. Inspired by the philosophy of calligraphy, the «figuro-abstro» tells, like this mysterious scriptural art, an imaginary writing, an universal language and the intimate story of fragments of the artist's personal life and travels. At the age of 37 he thus lays the groundwork for deep reflection on current issues as the ecology, the place of women in society, the racism and the notion of transmission or heritage. In September 2023, he is invited at the Musée des Beaux-Arts de Rouen for a special project in dialogue with the impressonist collections. In January 2024, the artist will have a solo exhibition at Galerie Templon.

In April 2024, the artist will have the honour of representing his country at the first Senegalese Pavilion at the 60th Art Biennale International Art Exhibition in Venice.

JIM DINE

Born in 1935, Jim Dine grew up in Ohio and started his career in 1950s New York with a series of happenings that attracted a great deal of attention. In the 1960s, he exhibited his assemblages and first paintings alongside the new generation of pop artists, from Jasper Johns to Robert Rauschenberg. A multi-faceted artist fascinated by the question of savoirfaire, he applied himself to learning print-making, photography and monumental sculpture. Introspection is central to his work, which obsessively delves into a number of recurring motifs, including body fragments, the heart, tools, Venus and Pinocchio. Jim Dine has spent the last 60 years travelling the world, sharing his time between various foundries, studios and print workshops, from Goettingen in Germany to New York, Wala-Wala on the US West Coast to Saint Gallen in Switzerland. Over the last ten years, poetry has emerged as one of the core elements of his practice, and he regularly gives readings and performances of his poems.

Jim Dine's work features in over 70 public collections across the world, including at the MoMA, Guggenheim and Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, Centre Pompidou in Paris and Tate Collection in London.

In 2023, the artist had a major show at the new Kunsthalle Göttingen in Germany.

ROBIN KID

Robin Kid (b. 1991), is an autodidact multidisciplinary artist from Dutch descent. His works hijack a variety of social, political and traditional imagery of the past and present, with rebellious, religious, fantastical and in some ways offensive undertones. He pulls intuitively from the world of advertising, the Internet, the entertainment industry and his childhood memories, to produce ambitious, enigmatic and thought-provoking narratives, which question the polarized world of the 21st century.

In 2023, he had a second solo show in Paris with Templon with his new series « Kingdom of Ends ». He took over the entire gallery to create an immersive experience consisting of painting, sculpture and installation, all centered around a two-story high mobile.

JONATHAN MEESE

Over the last twenty or so years Meese has developed an uncategorizable body of work, lying somewhere between expressionism and actionism, combining painting, sculpture, installations and performance. His work questions the boundary between culture and nature, creativity and conformism, appearance and power, proposing a singular philosophy where art alone can serve as our guide to the evolving world.

Jonathan Meese was born in Tokyo in 1970 and lives and works in Berlin and Ahrensburg. His work has featured in numerous international exhibitions since he first exhibited in Berlin and at the Berlin Biennale in 1998. He has taken part in various major group shows such as Generation Z at PS1 in New York (1999), New Blood at the Saatchi Collection in London (2004) and Dionysiac at the Pompidou Centre in Paris (2005). The Deichtorhallen in Hamburg and Magasin de Grenoble organised a retrospective of his work in 2006: Mama Johnny. Other notable exhibitions of his work include those held at the Miami MOCA (2011), Akademie der Künste in Vienna (2012), Prague National Gallery (2015), Kunsthistoriches Museum in Vienna (2017), Carré Sainte-Anne in Montpellier (2017) and Pinakothek der Moderne in Munich (2018). In 2019, the artist took the Dr Zuhause: K.U.N.S.T (Erzliebe) project to Lübeck where it occupied all the city's exhibition spaces. In 2022, in collaboration with young artist Conny Maier, he put together a large-scale exhibition entitled Hansel and Gretel (Let me in Ruh') in Aurich, Germany.

In 2023, Jonathan Meese had an extravagant exhibition delving into the power of tales and legends with DOCTOR-DOC-DR.-"HIGH NOON" IS BACK! (WONDERLAND DE LARGE) at TEMPLON in Paris.





PRUNE NOURRY

Born in 1985 in Paris, Prune Nourry lives and works in New York and Paris. In her projects, the artist raises ethical questions related to the notion of balance in the broadest sense: the body and healing, the demographic imbalance due to gender selection and scientific excesses, the ecosystem, and the interdependence between living species.

Her artistic approach combines sculpture, installations, performances and video. One of her works is the army of *Terracotta Daughters*, sculptures inspired by the Xi'an warriors. She took the army on a world tour between 2013 and 2015, from Paris to Shanghai with stopovers in Zurich, New York and Mexico City, before burying it in China where it will stay until 2030. Produced in 2019, her film Serendipity was presented at the Berlin Film Festival, MoMa DOC Fortnight documentary film festival and Tribeca Film Festival and shown as part of the Art Basel film programme.

The first French artist to be invited to exhibit by Bon Marché Rive Gauche, she created a series of emblematic works during lockdown including the monumental installation Amazone Érogène. In 2022, the installation "Mater Earth" by Prune Nourry joined the Château La Coste's permanent collection. On the occasion of the Crans-Montana Biennial and in collaboration with Sculpture Garden, Prune Nourry exhibits her artwork Cracked Head #4 until March 31, 2024.

Born in 1922 in Soviet Russia, Olitski emigrated to the USA in infancy and went on to study at New York University. He is one of Color Field Painting's key figures as defined by US critic Clement Greenberg, whose pioneers include Barnett Newman, Mark Rothko and Clyfford Still; the second generation comprised Jules Olitski, Kenneth Noland and Morris Louis, practitioners of a 'self-critical painting' centred on its own specific attributes (Ann Hindry).


PHILIP PEARLSTEIN

Born in 1924 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, USA, Philip Pearlstein has been living and working in New York for almost 70 years. He studied at the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh then the New York University Institute of Fine Arts, where he formed a friendship with Ad Reinhardt. Philip Pearlstein worked as a graphic designer for Life Magazine before teaching at the Pratt Institute, Brooklyn then at Brooklyn College, New York. He has also been a guest artist at a great number of prestigious American institutions, including Yale University.

New York's Brooklyn Museum held a retrospective of his work in 1983. In 2018, the Saatchi Gallery in London dedicated a widely acclaimed exhibition to his work. He has recently exhibited at the Susquehanna Art Museum (SAM), Harrisburg, Pennsylvania in 2017, the National Academy Museum, New York and New York Studio School, New York (curated by Robert Storr) in 2014, and the Museum of Fine Arts, St. Petersburg, Florida in 2013.

His work features in over 70 public American collections, including at the Museum of Modern Art, New York, Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, and National Gallery of Art, Washington, as well as at Tate Britain (London), Berlin Nationalgalerie, Museum Ludwig (Cologne) and the Berardo Collection Museum (Lisbon).

Philip Pearlstein passed away in New York City, in December 2022.

GEORGE SEGAL

Born in 1924 in New York, George Segal lived and worked in New Jersey, USA, until his death in 2000. Since 1962, when the artist was discovered at a group Pop art collective exhibition, George Segal's sculptures have achieved international acclaim. Among his numerous solo exhibitions were major retrospectives in 1978 at Walker Art Center, Minneapolis; San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, CA; Whitney Museum of American Art, New York, NY, USA, in 1997 at the Musée des Beaux-Arts de Montréal (Canada), in 1998 at the Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden, Washington, D.C; in 2002 at Utsunomiya Museum of Art, Utsunomia, Japan and at the Hermitage State Museum in St Petersburg(Russia). Galerie Templon presented George Segal's works for the first time in 1979 in Paris, as part of the group exhibition La peinture américaine. George Segal's work features in the most prestigious international collections, such as the MoMA (New York), Moderna Museet (Stockholm), du Musée d'art moderne de la Ville de Paris (MamvP), Kunsthaus Zurich or Israel Museum.

George Segal's tableaux are reflections on the individual and the consumer society. He plays on the permeability of spaces, inviting the viewer to converse with his anonymous and motionless figures. George Segal developed a layered plaster bandage moulding technique by applying the bandages directly to the model's body. He used this technique to reveal the evocative power of gesture and its poetic, social, erotic and political dimensions.

In 2023, Templon's New York space was celebrating its first anniversary with an exhibition that took visitors on a journey over 25 years of the artist's career.




Exhibition view - Nocturnal Fragments, TEMPLON, New York, 2023



Born in Osaka, Japan, in 1972, Chiharu Shiota has been living and working in Berlin for over two decades. Her work has featured in a wide range of solo exhibitions and is shown worldwide. In 2015, she created an installation for the Japanese Pavilion at the Venice Biennale. In 2022, her work was exhibited at the Aichi Arts Center in Japan; Manifesta 14, Kosovo; Musée National des Arts Asiatiques-Guimet, Paris: Planta Project, Complejo industrial La Plana del Corb, Balaquer, Lleida, Spain: Schauwerk Sindelfingen, Germany: Queensland Art Gallery of Modern Art in Brisbane, Australia: Bangkok Art Biennale in Thailand and K11 Museum in Hong Kong. In 2023, Chiharu Shiota's installation The Ship of Memories has joined the permanent collection of the Fukuoka Art Museum in Japan.




Exhibition view - The Ship of Memories, Fukuoka Art Museum, Japan, 2023



KEHINDE WILEY

Kehinde Wiley (b. 1977, Los Angeles) is an American artist best known for his portraits that render people of color in the traditional settings of Old Master paintings. Wiley's work brings art history face-to-face with contemporary culture, using the visual rhetoric of the heroic, the powerful, the majestic and the sublime to represent Black and brown people the artist has met throughout the world. Working in the mediums of painting, sculpture, and video. Wiley's portraits challenge and reorient art-historical narratives, awakening complex issues that many would prefer remain muted. In 2018, following a commission by the Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery in Washington, he became the first African-American artist to paint an official U.S. Presidential portrait. Former U.S. President Barack Obama chose to be portrayed by Kehinde Wiley. In 2019, Wiley founded Black Rock Senegal, a multidisciplinary artist-in-residence program that invites artists from around the world to live and create work in Dakar, Senegal. Wiley is the recipient of the U.S. Department of State's Medal of Arts, Harvard University's W.E.B. Du Bois Medal, and France's distinction of Knight of the Order of Arts and Letters. He holds a BFA from San Francisco Art Institute, an MFA from Yale University, and honorary doctorates from the Rhode Island School of Design and San Francisco Art Institute. He has held solo exhibitions throughout the United States and internationally and his works are included in the collections of over 60 public institutions around the world. He lives and works in Dakar, Lagos and New York. His project «A Maze of Power» is currently on display at Musée du quai Branly Jacques Chirac in Paris until January 2024.


