Chapter NY is pleased to present a new body of work by Stella Zhong for Art Basel Hong Kong Discoveries 2025.

Merging cosmic and infinitesimal scales at once, Stella Zhong's work brings together vast planes and granular objects that feel alive or even edible. Her installations translate existential and political conditions into tactile forms, refracting contemporary experiences of simultaneity, alienation, existential humor and uncertainty.

Zhong—from a generation with firsthand experience of the peak of China's urban development—is particularly interested in sites that evoke both dread and dreams. Her new sculptural-video installation and accompanying wall sculptures for Art Basel Hong Kong engage with city features of transparency and elevation that ultimately lead to impenetrability. The installation begins with an imagined fragment of a metropolis whose interior expands into a multitude of worlds merging extraterrestrial space and food, recalibrating that which is beyond reach and that which is to become internal. It transcends perspective, instead exploring shifts in scale and position that point to connectivity.

Stella Zhong (b. 1993, Shenzhen, China) lives and works in New York, NY. She holds a BFA in Glass from Rhode Island School of Design and an MFA from Yale University. Zhong has had solo exhibitions at Antenna Space, Shanghai, CN; The Intermission, Pireas, GR; Chapter NY, New York; Fanta-MLN, Milan; Adams and Ollman, Portland, OR; and Guan Shan Yue Art Museum, Shenzhen; among others. Zhong has exhibited internationally at The Power Station, Dallas, TX; Asia Society Texas Center, Houston, TX; Leeum Museum of Art, Seoul, KR; SculptureCenter, Queens, NY; The Aldrich Contemporary Art Museum, Ridgefield, CT; Galerie Marguo, Paris; in lieu, Los Angeles; Peana, Mexico City; YveYANG, New York; Mana Contemporary, Jersey City; HUA International, Beijing; M 2 3, New York; and more. Her work has been reviewed on ArtAsiaPacific, Mousse Magazine, Texte zur Kunst, The New York Times, Art in America, among others.




