

Gabriel Rodriguez (b.1985) is currently based in Los Angeles. Born in southern California, he grew up helping stretch paintings for his artist mother. While working within multiple facets of the New York art world for the last decade, he maintained a quiet but consistent studio practice that evolved from primarily works on paper into cut and sewn stretched paintings. Each painting begins with an image hastily painted onto various textiles and canvas, followed by cutting and stitching and reworking, until the resulting assemblage takes on the air of an idol.










Presenting the Day, 2021-2023 oil paint, mixed media on sewn canvas and linen 51"H x 54"W (GVR016)



Amia Yokoyama is a multimedia artist who works with experimental animation, video, sculpture, and installation, currently living and working in Los Angeles. Born into a bilingual, multicultural family in the midwest, she discovered her artistic abilities from an early age and began her exploration through ceramics. Theimagery in Yokoyama's work stems from her speculation about the future and exploration of the duality between wonder and horror. Throughout her practice, the artist creates with fragments from her current reality, and recombines them to amalgamate alternate universes. In her video work, Yokoyama focuses on mixing different materials and techniques; uses traditional stop motion animation, along with layering a digitally constructed environment and adding elements of live footage from her "reality". Overall, Amia seeks to ensure her work evokes a playful, otherworldly feeling, while creating a style that is suggestive of the future and the past.




