

For Frieze New York and her upcoming solo exhibition, Gair uses various subjects to imagine new frontiers in the language of abstract painting. Informed equally by craft adjacent projects and process based aesthetics, Gair stresses the act of the medium by prioritizing her moves, textures, and applications of paint. Gair renders ordinary subjects in extrodinary ways, such as pumpkins, books, couch cushions and sea-side landscapes. Detached from the weight of illustration and technique, Gair explores newfound forms of aesthetic freedom.

In Gair's paintings of 'piles of books', the spines of books become a device to play with shape and color, as well as a way to index her system of mark making. Gair begins by rendering the the painting in graphite, color-coding the respective books. Rather than paint over her color-key, Gair renders the books in ink washes, allowing for the text to show through. The paintings, as well as the 'books' being rendered, become containers for an expansive world to be imagined.

Couch, 2024 oil on canvas 44 x 88 inches, 111.76 x 223.52 cm \$ 16,000 USD Throughout Gair's work, symbols of the mundane become a space for childlike reverie. In a series of painted 'couch cushions', Gair has created an uncanny system of pulling paint, resulting in streaks or rainbows bands of color whisping in different directions, mimicking the design of textile. Gair sparingly leaves areas of paint blobs, referencing the way in which she conceives of each painted rainbow effect.



Gair's landscape paintings are a series where pointillist-like circles define an abstracted field of view. These works are materially chunky, each circle incised into her equally weighted-gessoed white backdrop, translating the vista of a bay in New Zealand. At times, the incisions into the gesso reveal a colorful underpainted surface, hinting at prior developments of her painting process.



Inspired by her paintings of couch cushions, Gair introduces new sculptural paintings, a first in her practice. The 'cushions', stuffed with fabric batting, are mounted to the wall in the shape of a bouquet of flowers. Mimicking the textile of a long forgotten suburban couch, these forms interlock like puzzlepieces, suggesting a memory both close and out of reach.
