

LEIKO IKEMURA

For this year's edition of Art Basel, Contemporary Fine Arts is excited to show a presentation with a main focus on works by Leiko Ikemura. The presentation will also include a section curated by the artist with positions from the gallery's program, announcing the gallery's very own space in Basel opening in August 2023.

Leiko Ikemura is an internationally renowned artist who has exhibited worldwide. After a celebrated solo exhibition *Towards New Seas* at Kunstmuseum Basel in 2019, this presentation is her first larger appearance in the city. In her paintings, drawings and sculptures, Ikemura explores contradictions that constitute our perceptions of the world and our very identities; presence and absence, vulnerability and empowerment; light and shadow; nature and culture. Her hybrid beings across mediums blur such boundaries as they draw from traditions of both Western and Eastern art, making even those discernments obsolete in the face of creative freedom.

In the words of Josef Helfenstein, director of Kunstmuseum Basel, Ikemura's career is a "unique synthesis of Japanese and Western culture." Her paintings and sculptures of hybrids between humans and animals, as well as paintings of Girls fixed between childhood and adulthood, equally transcend any specifications and definitions. Fascination with creatures that exist on the threshold between the real and the mythological awards Ikemura's works almost an otherworldly atmosphere, drawing from her very own specific background and experience. As the artist herself has said, "Our imagination is rich enough to guide us to other worlds."

Born in Japan, Ikemura has lived in Spain, Switzerland and Germany. 2019 marked the year of her triumphant artistic return to Japan with a solo exhibition *Our Planet Earth & Stars* at The National Art Center in Tokyo, a group exhibition at The National Museum of Modern Art in Tokyo, and the honor of the prestigious 70th Art Encouragement Prize of the Ministry of Education of Japan.


Ikemura's works are included in distinguished collections across the world, such as Centre Pompidou in Paris, Museum of Modern Art in Tokyo, National Museum of Art in Osaka, Kunstmuseum Basel, Kunstmuseum Bern, Kunsthaus Zürich, Albertina Wien, Mumok in Vienna, among many others.








Girl with a Baby 2021 Tempera & oil on jute, 120 x 100 cm / 47 ½ x 39 ⅓ in 90.000,00 €


