(New York) For Frieze New York 2026, **Marc Selwyn Fine Art** and **Ortuzar** will jointly present a solo booth of work by Akinsanya Kambon (b. 1946). The presentation features the Long Beach, California-based artist's ceramic vessels and figures produced using a Western adaptation of the Japanese Raku firing technique. Kambon's works draw on African mythologies, deities, and historical narratives, addressing legacies of violence and resistance across the United States, the African diaspora, and colonial and postcolonial Africa. These works are grounded in deeply personal narratives shaped by a lifetime of activism, service, and artistic inquiry.

This presentation precedes "Akinsanya Kambon: Soul Sessions," the first multi-venue survey of Kambon's work, opening at SculptureCenter and the Center for Art, Research and Alliances (CARA) in New York on May 28.
