Goodman Gallery's group presentation at Frieze New York 2025 looks towards cultural histories from the Global South, underscoring its commitment to artistic practices from the African continent, its diaspora and other interconnected regions. The works on view offer a powerful and poetic engagement with place, memory and identity.

Highlights include drawings by William Kentridge such as *Try to Understand this Simple Speech*, a layered ink and collage drawing that reinterprets South African histories. This work is shown alongside new maquettes that relate to the artist's acclaimed theatre production Oh To Believe in Another World. Kentridge's inclusion at Frieze New York comes ahead of his major museum exhibition at Yorkshire Sculpture Park in June 2025, the first institutional presentation outside South Africa to focus on his sculpture.

Shirin Neshat's iconic *Women of Allah* (1995) photographic series is also featured, marking a timely moment as the artist is celebrated in solo exhibitions at both PAC Padiglione d'Arte Contemporanea, Milan and The Parrish Art Museum, New York.

A large-scale painting by Pamela Phatsimo Sunstrum continues an exploration of feminine archetypes, expanding on ideas introduced in her 2024 solo exhibition at the Barbican, London, *It Will End In Tears*. Her cinematic approach will also be highlighted at this year's Taipei Biennial opening in November 2025.

A new painting by rising talent Ravelle Pillay examines how colonial histories impact the natural world, offering poignant reflections on power and memory. Her presence at Frieze New York coincides with a solo exhibition at Goodman Gallery New York and anticipates a major UK institutional commission to be unveiled in September 2025.

Other highlights include new quilts from Yinka Shonibare CBE RA's *African Bird Magic* series that point to the importance of challenging the consequences of Western colonial industrialisation in the degradation of the African environment. This body of work featured in his 2024 solo exhibition *Suspended States* at the Serpentine in London and follows his participation in the Nigerian Pavilion in the 2024 Venice Biennale.

Kapwani Kiwanga's ceramic and beaded sculptures trace narratives of transcultural exchange, material histories and speculative futures. These works build on her Canadian Pavilion presentation at the 2024 Venice Biennale, *Trinket*, and her recent solo at the Serralves Museum of Contemporary Art in Porto.

On view in Goodman Gallery New York will be *Le Café Parisien*, a painting by Gerard Sekoto. Regarded as one of the most influential painters in South African history and largely overlooked during his lifetime, Sekoto is now acknowledged for the significance of his contribution to the arts, and is renowned for his exceptional depictions of the sociological circumstances and lived experiences of urban black South Africans during the apartheid era as well as Paris's Bohemian heyday.






